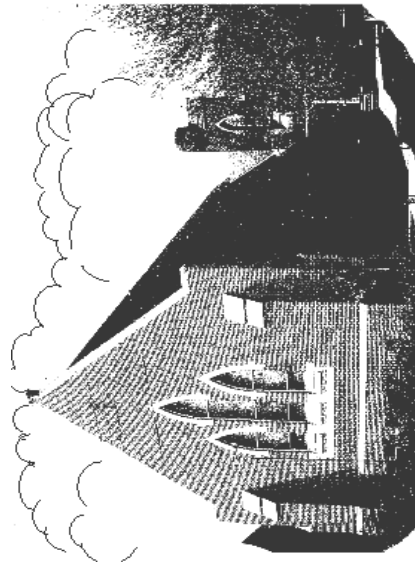

Upcoming Philippines Trip

This summer (Jun 10-29) I will have the opportunity to travel to the Philippines for a course in Maternal/Child Health and Disaster Preparedness. Additionally, I will be able to apply this knowledge as we travel to villages where families are in need of health services. This experience is made possible through an organization called **Mercy In Action**.

Mercy in Action is a Christian non-profit organization founded over a quarter century ago and dedicated to mercy ministry among the poor around the world. **Mercy In Action** exists to bring hope and healing to the poorest of the poor, wherever they are found, by serving with practical acts of compassion, as did the Samaritan in the story told by Jesus of what it means to "Love God and love your neighbor". Their focus has been on Maternal and Newborn Health, and Primary Health Care for Children under five, because these populations are the most vulnerable and most likely to die in the poorer areas of our world. I ask for your prayers for my safe travel and for my ability to have an open mind and heart as I work there. Additionally, I will be collecting donations that will go with me to be used for Mercy In Action ministries. If you feel led to donate, they are in need of the following: Gloves (both sterile and non-sterile), Gauze pads, Band-aids, Chux underpads, Adult or child disposable diapers, Individual packets of alcohol wipes, K-Y jelly, Antibiotic ointments like Neosporin, Hydrocortisone creams and ointments for burns, and Prenatal vitamins.

Mission Sunday will be May 1, 2011 during both services. Our guest speaker will be Vice-Chair of the Missions Central Board, Marshia Fisher. She is very excited to be with us that day and will be able to share all the exciting things going on at Mission Central.

Mission Central is currently in need of cleaning buckets because of all the localized floodings. Our plan from now until Mission Sunday is to ask for help in providing the following items:

5 gallon bucket with lid, Bleach , Liquid laundry detergent, Household cleaner (12-16 oz. bottle, Antibacterial dish soap (16 -28 oz. bottle), Heavy duty trash bags (33-45 gal.), 18 cleaning towels (reusable wipes); Clothesline, Clothes Pins, Scrub Brushes, Scouring Pads, Sponges, Dust Masks, Latex Gloves, Work Gloves, Insect repellent spray (6-14 oz. can) Airfreshner (8-9 oz. can).

We will assemble the cleaning buckets during the Sunday School hour on May 1.

GIVING

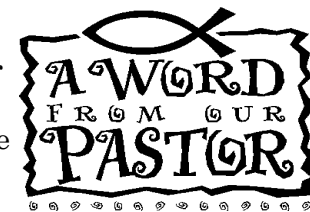
*“Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or

During the third step of the “Commitment to Christ 2020” program, worship attendees placed cards in the Covenant Box promising to step up towards the tithe. The people are called to return to God with a full measure of devotion in the Old Testament book of Malachi. Chapter 3:8-10 says *“How shall we return? Will man rob God? Yet you are robbing me. We are in need of the following: juice for toddlers and snacks such as vanilla wafers, goldfish, cheerios, and pretzels. Please no candy or cookies.

Also, just as a reminder: the nursery appreciates any donations made in the form of books or toys; however, the following guidelines should be reviewed before donating these items to the nursery:

- Toys should not be small enough to fit into a small child's mouth and toys/books should not have parts that are small enough to fit into the child's mouth
- Books should not include pictures of or storylines involving the following: drugs, alcohol, violence, warfare, guns and/or other weaponry
- Toys should not have parts relating to the following: drugs, alcohol, violence, warfare, guns and/or other weaponry
- Any item donated should meet current safety standards. If you are unsure whether or not the item has been recalled, visit <http://www.cpsc.gov/> or contact Whitney Wagner.

REMINDER: NO child under 18 should be allowed in the nursery without adult supervision for any amount of time under any circumstances.
